

My dear fellow Disciplers,

Summer has drawn to a close and I hope you have all enjoyed a time of rest and relaxation with family and friends, along with special quiet times of fellowship with the Lord. Most of all I hope you have been eager to return to study with like-minded friends. The Bible is a never-ending treasure trove of truth that is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness so that we, the people of God, may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work (2 Timothy 3:16-17).

God's Word has been uppermost in my thoughts the past few months as I have been taking time to linger in Psalm 119, not only the longest psalm, but also the longest chapter in the Bible. The 176 verses are divided into 22 stanzas, one for each letter of the Hebrew alphabet. I have been studying stanza by stanza, and discovering the glory of God's Word, for that is the psalmist's subject. In the end, he sees that God's Word is life to His soul, he depends upon its promises, delights in it, longs to obey it completely, and is so moved by what he learns that he bursts into praise to God. Tarrying in Psalm 119 has given me new appreciation for God's Word and new joy in studying. 
